Dear Parents.

We come to the end of a short term that was packed with progress for the children and the school.

We feel that the changes made to parent consultations promoted a calm environment for useful discussions. We will be keeping the format of spreading the meetings over two areas of the school.

Attendance

There has been much in the media recently about attendance and the issuing of Fixed Penalty Notices. As of 19th August, a statutory document, 'Working together to improve school attendance' will be followed by all schools. This includes schools sharing attendance data with the Department for Education. Children's attendance recorded as a percentage and is recorded over the academic year. The Department for Education define any child below 90% attendance as a persistent absentee and any child under 50% as severely absent.

We will be providing more information about this in the summer term. The importance of attendance cannot be overstated and those of you who have already discussed this with me, or another member of the Senior Leadership Team, will know that we want the best outcomes for our learners.
