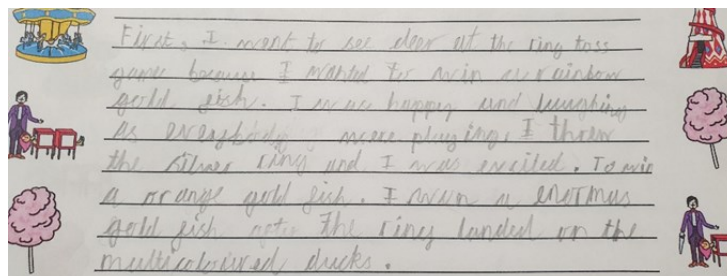
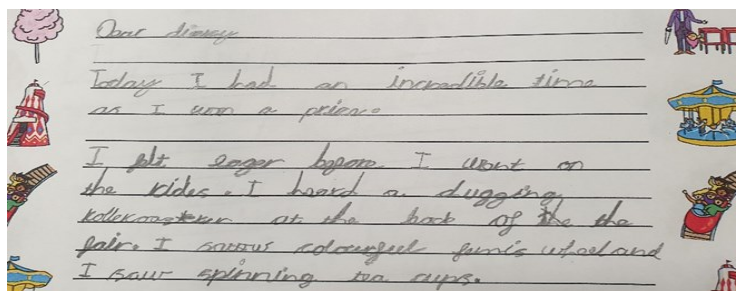
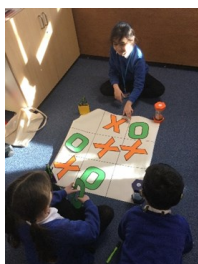

What we've been up to...

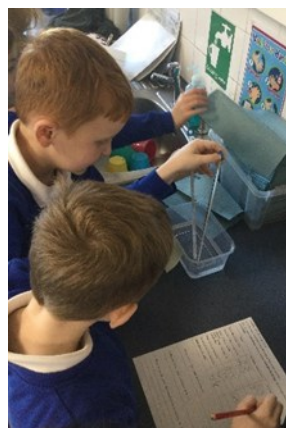
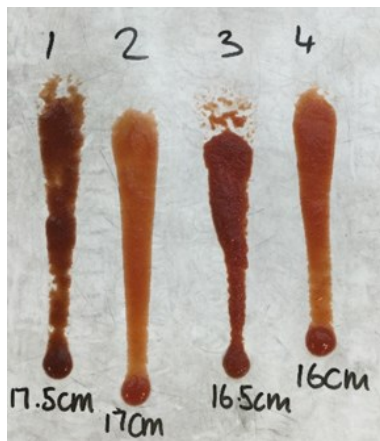
Beech Class

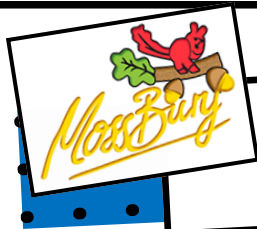
Over the last three weeks, we have been writing recounts based on the book "The Midnight Fair". Last week, we played some fairground games in the classroom and then wrote our recounts from the perspective of one of the animals who went to the fair.



In Science, we have been looking at the different states of matter and whether all liquids behave the same. We did an experiment to find out which ketchup would be the best for our hotdogs - not too runny and not too thick! Then, we investigated the temperature of water that been left in different areas (outside on the playground, in the classroom, from the kettle). We made a prediction about the temperature of each container of water and then used thermometers to accurately measure the temperature in degrees Celsius.

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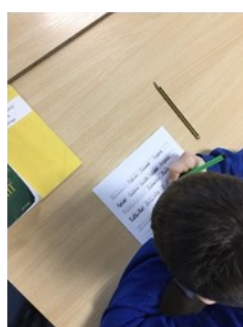
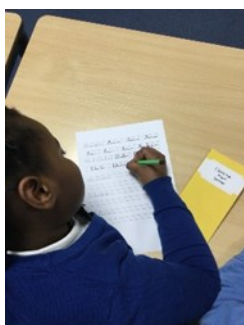
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Cedar Class

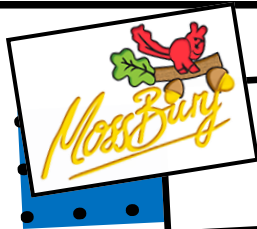
This week in cedar class, we have been working on our handwriting and presentation. We have been making sure to join up all our letters neatly, in order to get a pen licence.
